- In 1986 the ACF was created by combining six existing programs from within the HHS.
- The Administration for Children and Families was created April 15, 1991.
- This was made to merge together the office of :
  - Human Development Services
  - Family Support Administration
  - Maternal and Child Health Block Grant programs.
- Division of the Department of Health and Human Services (HSS)

Today the ACF is one of the 11 operating divisions in the Human Health Services.

# Role the organization plays in providing oral health care



Provides Guidance and Assistance with programs to help financially and educate on the importance of dental care

- Head Start Program (through HHS)
  - Funded by the federal government
    - 40 million children and their families
  - Promotes oral health, disease prevention, and treatment
  - Ensure children are be up-to-date on age appropriate preventative dental care within 90 days of enrollment
  - Conduct ongoing screenings and assessments to ensure oral ealth progress

#### Professional roles of the Dental Professional within the organization

- Easing infant teeth pain
- Promoting dental visits by the age of 1 dental
- Understanding importance of primary teeth
- Identifying oral signs of mistreatment
- Preventing and treating oral injuries
- Identifying dietary contributions to dental decay
- Reducing Fear of dental visits

- Provide patient care
- Oral health exams
- Dental diagnosis and treatment
- Promote oral health
- Preventive treatment
- Implement OHI
- Reduce dental pain that can lead to trouble speaking clearly and eating

- Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islanders

  - Guam
- ACF established the Native American Affairs Advisory Council (NAAAC) and ACF Tribal Advisory Committee (TAC)
  - supports government-to-government relationship between American Indian and Alaska Native Tribes and the federal government
